Voted 1. That Cap<sup>t</sup> Thomas Wallingford should be the Moderator for the present meeting. But presently a Dispute arose concerning the Legality of the Choice, and it was much Suspected by many, that Several pertuuler persons, carried in more than one Votes, the Moderator being at first choosen, by written Votes, it was then consented to, by the Moderator, that the Dispute should be Decided by a Pole, the Moderator himself accordingly Drew out of the Meeting House, and all such Voters, as desired that he should moderate the meeting, retired unto him; and all such as were contrary minded, retired unto Cap<sup>t</sup> Thomas Millit, who was at first voted for, in opposition to Cap<sup>t</sup> Wallingford; But after the Pole was over and the Voters returned into the House, there were very different Opinions returned concerning the Number that appeared for each man Poted for; and it was again consented to, by the Moderator first choosen, that there should be a Second Pole to decide the Debate, which arose about it, and Cap<sup>t</sup> Wallingford, and Cap<sup>t</sup> Millit withdrawing, as before; and the Voters polling as at first, it was Determined that Cap<sup>t</sup> Thomas Millit should be the Moderator, for said meeting, who was accordingly Declard, and Recorded.

Then the Meeting was Adjourned to the next Friday at Ten of the Clock in the fore-room.
