ACTIVITIES : OF THE COMMITTEE.

- Worked closely with Housing Navigator for outreach activities
- Provided guidance and recommendations for the SRPC Land Use Audit
- Analyzed community needs survey responses and developed report writing strategies based on three pillars: Zoning Reform, Community Education, and Economic Development.
- Recommended uses for the InvestNH grant money including new Assistant Planner position
- Delivered 45-page report to City Council for acceptance, public consideration, and commitment to implement proposed solutions

SHORT TERM ACTION

Based on the extensive report recommendations:

- Establish a Standing Housing Commission
 - Oversight of housing policies and development incentives.
 - Coordination of community engagement and educational campaigns.

Zoning and Planning Adjustments

- Allow conversions and infill developments to increase affordable housing supply.
- Expand relaxed regulations for Accessory Dwelling Units

Invest in vulnerable populations

- Emergency shelter options and supportive services
- Infrastructure for accessible designs
- Prioritized projects to address rising housing costs for Workforce Housing

LONG TERM ACTION

Sustained Policy and Financial Support:

- o Incentivize inclusive zoning and mixed-income development projects.
- Develop Employer-Assisted Housing programs.

Public-Private Partnerships:

 Partner with local businesses, financial institutions, and developers to finance and implement affordable housing solutions.

Holistic Community Engagement:

- Ongoing education on housing benefits and policies.
- Regular assessment and adjustment of housing strategies.

Strategic Housing Development:

- Prioritize redevelopment, adaptive reuse, and innovative housing models (e.g., tiny homes, co-housing).
- Commitment to long-term infrastructure improvements to support housing growth.
