Progress the jurisdiction has made in carrying out its strategic plan and its action plan. 91.520(a)

This could be an overview that includes major initiatives and highlights that were proposed and executed throughout the program year.

<u>Access to Services</u>: AIDS Response Seacoast assisted 20 individuals. There were 11 persons assisted by My Friend's Place shelter and transitional shelters. The numbers for MFP were low as the shelter was closed a majority of the year for improvements.

<u>Accessibility and Transportation</u>: The Alliance for Community Transportation served 52 Dover clients. There were no barrier removal projects in PY23.

<u>Renter and Homeowner Assistance</u>: CAP provided weatherization and energy efficiency improvements to 5 households. Dover Welfare Department provided 4 households with security deposit assistance while HAVEN provided rental assistance for 2 households.

Public Service accomplishments were exceeded by some subrecipients while others were below their anticipated count. Overall, the total count for public services exceeded the anticipated total. Two of the three funded public facilities activities did not occur. These were a barrier removal activity and a rental rehab activity. The third activity was the weatherization and energy efficiency program that assisted 5 households.

The *Non-Homeless* household count was less than projected. The 5 actual, versus 11 anticipated, households that benefited from the Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Activity was due to the fact that the costs for the 5 projects consumed the funds allocated for the activity. The anticipated 3 households that would benefit from the Rental Unit rehab activity did not materialize as the program was not undertaken. The 4 households that benefited from the security deposit program exceeded the total of 3 households anticipated in the AP.

We do not anticipate the PY23 results having any impact on future Action Plans. Dover is developing our next strategic plan that will reflect the communities priority needs that will in turn dictate the resources applied to achieving these outcomes.

Narrative Information

Housing related concerns are a significant issue for the community as expressed by the City Council and through feedback from the public. The next strategic plan is likely to include efforts to continue to support programs that provide assistance to households in need of housing assistance.

CR-25 - Homeless and Other Special Needs 91.220(d, e); 91.320(d, e); 91.520(c)

Evaluate the jurisdiction's progress in meeting its specific objectives for reducing and ending homelessness through:

Reaching out to homeless persons (especially unsheltered persons) and assessing their individual needs

Community Action Partnership, Dover Police Department, SOS Recovery Community Organization, NH Harm Reduction and the Dover Mental Health Alliance all have continued contact with the unsheltered homeless population.

Addressing the emergency shelter and transitional housing needs of homeless persons

Dover provided operational funds for the for My Friend's Place that operates an emergency shelter and transitional housing located in Dover.

The Warming Center of Strafford County, owned by the Dover and located Somersworth, was utilized on an as needed basis for extreme cold weather events from November through April. The low-barrier overnight shelter served unhoused residents from Dover and neighboring communities.

Helping low-income individuals and families avoid becoming homeless, especially extremely low-income individuals and families and those who are: likely to become homeless after being discharged from publicly funded institutions and systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care and other youth facilities, and corrections programs and institutions); and, receiving assistance from public or private agencies that address housing, health, social services, employment, education, or youth needs

The CDBG program did not fund programs that are designed specifically to work with individuals who have been discharged. Dover provided CDBG funding to AIDS Response Seacoast (ARS) @ \$8,100.00 that was used to help costs associated with providing case management services to clients with HIV/AIDS.

Helping homeless persons (especially chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans and their families, and unaccompanied youth) make the transition to permanent housing and independent living, including shortening the period of time that individuals and families experience homelessness, facilitating access for homeless individuals and families to affordable housing units, and preventing individuals and families who were recently homeless from becoming homeless again

CDBG funding was allocated to My Friend's Place that provides emergency shelter programs and

transitional housing programs & assistance. We did not specifically fund programs targeted to veterans. Conversations with various agency staff have indicated that, at times, their clients have been veterans but not as part of a target group for assistance.

Actions taken to address the needs of public housing

The Dover Housing Authority expanded its ability to assist community residents by participating in HUDs Moving to Work program. As part of that effort, the Authority partnered with HAVEN to provide new housing for survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence.

Actions taken to encourage public housing residents to become more involved in management and participate in homeownership

The Dover Housing Authority maintains a Resident Advisory Board that meets to review DHA annual and five year plans. The Resident Advisory Board holds regular meetings and provides input on general DHA operations and special projects.

Actions taken to provide assistance to troubled PHAs

The Dover Housing Authority is not designated as a troubled agency by HUD

Actions taken to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment. 91.220 (j); 91.320 (i)

The City of Dover contracted with the local RPC to perform an analysis of current Dover regulations that may hinder development of affordable housing. The report will provide changes that the RPC believes should be considered to promote availability and diversity of housing.

Additionally, the City Council created a Housing Task Force that is responsible for assessing the City's affordable house situation and provide findings and recommendations to the City Council.

The City has funded the Housing Navigator position that was, up to this point a grant funded position. A major focus for the housing navigator is to identify opportunities to increase development of affordable units and help create the pathways to do so. The Housing Navigator worked with local lenders to create a new lending tool for lenders to provide home owners with the ability to borrow funds for the building of accessory dwelling units. The loans are now available through a few lenders.

Actions taken to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The City has contracted with the local RPC to undertake a housing needs study that will result in recommended changes to local laws and regulations with the intent of fostering development of housing for households that currently experience difficulty in securing affordable housing.

Actions taken to reduce lead-based paint hazards. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The weatherization and energy efficiency projects undertaken with CDBG funding all follow lead protocols. Lead safe practices are being used for a window replacement project at a transitional housing site.

Actions taken to reduce the number of poverty-level families. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Available CDBG economic development funds we not utilized in PY23. The city is now in the process of restructuring the approach taken for economic development. Dover's Office of Business Development is working with Planning Department staff to identify new pathways for best deploying CDBG funds that will benefit local businesses including a microenterprise program. Additionally, the majority of activities undertaken by the City of Dover with CDBG funds are efforts to reduce the number of persons/households in poverty and improve the quality of life for residents, either directly or indirectly.

Actions taken to develop institutional structure. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

Staff continued to update the CDBG policies and procedures manual to assure consistency of implementation.

Actions taken to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies. 91.220(k); 91.320(j)

The Dover Housing Authority engages with regional service providers to coordinate delivery of programs and services. Dover's CDBG program meets with the Housing Authority on a quarterly basis to identify opportunities for collaboration. Dover's Housing Navigator role includes working in this space and has made efforts to link providers with resources that can help enhance their services.

An assessment of Dover's land use policies by the local RPC began in PY23 and will generate recommendations to improve the development of new housing and housing options in Dover. The Tri-City Master Plan on Homelessness identifies several barriers to affordable housing that include various degrees of public policy or funding related obstacles.

Beyond required minimum notices for CDBG related actions, the City places notice of action plans and CAPERS in a weekly download to citizens and posts related information on the website.
