DOVER POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES BURGLARY ARREST

DOVER, NH, November 19, 2024- Chief William Breault of the Dover Police Department announces that an arrest has been made as a result of a burglary investigation.

On the morning of November 17, 2024, Dover Police officers responded to Atlas-Heritage Title Office located at 903 Central Avenue for a reported burglary. Responding officers discovered that the closed business had been entered through an exterior window and that the suspect was no longer present. Investigators assigned to the department's Crime Scene Unit processed the scene and collected comparative evidence in an attempt to identify the suspect.

The next morning, an employee returned to the business and found that it again had been unlawfully entered. The employee located the suspect inside the business, who promptly fled the scene upon discovery. Responding officers, with the assistance of a New Hampshire State Police canine, located 44-year-old Rocky Brogna nearby. A subsequent investigation by Dover Police detectives identified Brogna as the person who twice entered the building.

Brogna, a transient in the area, was charged with two counts of felony Burglary and one misdemeanor charge of False Report to Law Enforcement for providing a false name during the arrest process. Brogna refused the services of a bail commissioner and is being held at the Strafford County House of Corrections. His arraignment is scheduled at the 7th Circuit Court – District Division – Dover, on November 19, 2024, at 10:00 A.M.
