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WHAT WE DO

The City of Dover's Public Welfare
Department is responsible for providing
general assistance to meet the genuine
emergency needs of eligible Dover
residents in compliance with RSA 165 and
city guidelines.

Four things you should know about Public Welfare:

- We are the only city department that is required by state law.
- We are primarily tasked with helping the residents of Dover.
 - We assist clients by addressing their emergency needs until they receive other services or income.
- We work with many other agencies and organizations to help residents become self-sufficient.

The Process:

4. Final Step

Notice of Decision is given. A voucher is created. Client and outcome are recorded. data

1. Initial Contact


Client expresses their needs over the phone or via a walk-in, or is referred by another agency.

3. Interview

Documents are examined, information is verified, and eligibility is determined.

2. Intake Process

Basic information is gathered. Client is given a list of documentation necessary for interview process.

Did You Know....

So far this year, Dover Welfare;

- Has had 1,317 customer contacts.
- Served 964 Dover residents.
- Handled 4,742 phone calls.
- Opened 105 new cases.
- Managed 461 active cases.

Other Welfare Activities;

- Participate in committees and attend meetings around the issues of Local Welfare, Homelessness and Housing.
- Director sits on the Welfare Executive Board as legislative committee chair.
- Attend regular Community Care Team meetings to coordinate services to clients.
- Hosting a UNH Social Work intern.
- Continuously pursue further training to improve customer service.

A Few Facts and Figures

- Rents have increased 33% in Strafford county since 2019.
- Average rent for a 2 Bedroom apartment in Dover is currently \$2,096.
- To afford this according to the Federal formula that a family should pay 33% of their income for rent and utilities a family needs to have an income of \$75,456 a year.
- In New Hampshire the average income is around \$62,000.
- According to New Hampshire Coalition to end Homelessness in 2024 the PIT count data showed an increase in those experiencing homelessness of 52.1% in New Hampshire.
