- I. RSA 72:37 provides the following exemptions based on assessed value for qualified taxpayers: \$115,000 off the assessed value of the property.
- II. APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS:

Must be the owner of record on or before April 1, 2020 Must occupy the property as their principal place of abode

- A. Must have been a resident of New Hampshire for at least one (1) year preceding April 1st of the year in which the exemption is claimed.
- B. If the applicant is the true and lawful Beneficial Interest Owner of a Trust, that qualifies under the same guidelines as any other owner of property. They must satisfy the assessor that they are the true beneficiary of the trust. Supply a copy of the page of the trust that indicates you are a beneficiary. Also must file Form PA-33 (Statement of Qualification) for property owned by a trust.

III. Filing:

- a) The Blind Exemption requirements, instructions, and conditions (this page) is available online available online http://www.dover.nh.gov/government/city-operations/finance/tax-assessment/applications/index.html;
- b) PERMANENT APPLICATION FOR TAX CREDIT/EXEMPTIONS Form PA-29, required by RSA 72:33 must be filed with the worksheet;
- c) In the case of a Trust or Life Estate, Form PA-33 is also required; and
- d) Every inhabitant who is legally blind as determined by the blind services program must submit a copy of a letter, indicating that you are registered as legally blind from:
